A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRIEST

My dear parishioners,

On November 15, we will enter Christmas Lent. This lenten period will prepare us to celebrate the greatest miracle in the life of humankind, the Incarnation of the Word of God.

This pre-Christmas period should be a time of prayer and serious thought. We must contemplate the meaning of God taking a human form and entering our world. Despite the turmoil and demands in our lives, we must try and discern God's plan "By attentive prayer and silent meditation." It is not something that we can achieve overnight, says Archbishop Anthony Bloom, only gradually "as our will becomes trained and the concentration of our heart and mind improves, we will be able to spend whole days in prayer. This prayer will not be merely the prayer of daily life which cannot yet transform it, but a much more conscious, deeper prayer..."

Man is called to participate in God, without any confusion between his nature and that of God, without any diminution of his freedom. In the words of the late Father John Meyendorff, "On the contrary, it is in this communion that he finds, in total feeling of

This complete attention is the essence of contemplative attitude and it is developed in the words of the Psalmist, "Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice! Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplication!" (Psalm 130: 1-2)

This Christmas season calls us beyond our everyday concerns to the deeper promise of Jesus Christ. Our Lord nurtures and expands the desires of our hearts as we grow in faith and love. From the depths of our hearts we pray to Him. "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find," says Jesus Christ, encouraging us finally to ask for no less than the gift of "the Holy Spirit" (Luke 11:9,13), the very life of God in us! This is a Christmas gift to cherish.

Thus praying, we too like the Fathers of the Church and the Saints pouring out our hearts and feeling the presence of Jesus Christ, are transformed by Him in a union that He accomplishes for our salvation. This is a contemplative attitude. This attitude should permeate our whole life. This kind of prayer is not the exclusive property of the monk or the ascetic, or even the clergy. It is the very heart of the Orthodox faith, if you wish, the way of living the Orthodox faith, the Orthodox Ethos. It is the prayer and the transformation of every Christian who opens his or her heart to welcome the little babe of Bethlehem, Jesus Christ. This is the Christmas gift that God wants to give us.

I wish you with all my heart a very happy Thanksgiving and a spiritually transforming Christmas season. Amen.

"Both ancient Greek art and literature preserve many touching images of children that clearly convey to us the sorrows, fears, and joys that children experienced, the difficulties the encountered, and their growing awareness of the world around them (a fact of their increasing maturity). Life in the fifth and fourth centuries B.C. was not easy by any standard. The threats of warfare, hunger, and disease were constant sources of concern for families, and children were the most vulnerable victims of all the realities. At the same time, the Greeks appreciated the pleasures provided by life. The family unit was highly valued, and children generally enjoyed the loving protection of their elders. Like children today, children in ancient times were educated in reading, writing, music, and sports. They also loved having pets and playing games. Numerous celebrations that marked important religious festivals and rites of passage offered welcome relief from daily cares, and, as the source indicate, children often played important roles in these events."
