Bishop Gerasimos of Krateia Elected Metropolitan of San Francisco

New York, NY – The Holy and Sacred Synod of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople elected His Grace Bishop Gerasimos of Krateia as the new Metropolitan of San Francisco. Metropolitan Gerasimos will succeed Metropolitan Anthony who died December 25, 2004.

The Metropolitan-elect was chosen for the see of the Metropolis of San Francisco from a list of three candidates whose names were submitted to the Holy and Sacred Synod of the Ecumenical Patriarchate by the Holy Eparchial Synod of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America.

Metropolitan Gerasimos has been serving as Chief Secretary of the Holy Eparchial Synod since his elevation to the episcopacy on February 9, 2002, which took place at the Annunciation Cathedral in Boston, MA.

He was born on August 2, 1945 in Kalamata, Greece where he completed his primary and secondary education. In September 1969 he matriculated at Hellenic College, Brookline, MA, graduating in 1973 with a B.A. with High Distinction. He continued his studies at Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology, earning his M. Div. with High Distinction in 1976. Following graduation, he was appointed Registrar of Hellenic College/Holy Cross, a post that he held until 1979.

On December 16, 1979, Metropolitan Gerasimos was ordained to the Diaconate and appointed Archdeacon to His Eminence Archbishop Iakovos, serving in this position until 1996. From 1980 until May 1986, he was Dean of Students of HC/HC. During this period.

In 1986 he entered the Master of Arts Program at Boston College. Upon successful completion of this program, he was accepted into the Doctoral Program at Boston College School of Education earning a Ph.D. in School and Counseling Psychology in June 1993. His doctoral dissertation was a study of intellectual deficits in a severe alcoholic population.

Metropolitan Gerasimos taught for a number of years at Hellenic College as well as Northeastern University, where he holds the title of Senior Lecturer. At the same time he was appointed a staff member at the Veterans Administration Medical Center (Boston), in the Department of Psychology (1991-1995). In 1990, he was reappointed as the Dean of Students at Hellenic College/Holy Cross, a post that he held until 1998, when he became Director of Admissions and Records. In 2000, he was named Administrative Assistant to the President of Hellenic College/Holy Cross School of Theology, the Rev. Father Nicholas Triantafilou.

Father Stathis immediately sent a letter of congratulations and warmest wishes to newly elected Metropolitan Gerasimos as the spiritual leader of our Metropolis of San

Francisco. We wish to Metropolitan Gerasimos success in his new Archpastoral ministry. May God strengthen him granting him many healthy and fruitful years. AXIOS!

FINAL INTERMENT OF METROPOLITAN ANTHONY

On Wednesday, March 2, 2005 the final interment of our beloved Metropolitan Anthony took place on his 70th birthday.

In keeping with Metropolitan Anthony's wishes, the interment took place at the Monastery of the Theotokos the Life Giving Spring on grounds of St. Nicholas Ranch in Dunlap, California. Divine Liturgy celebrated at 10:00 a.m. in the Katholikon of the monastery, followed by a luncheon. The interment took place at 1:00 p.m. Presvytera Maria Mylonas and Judie Christopoulos attended the Holy Services and the final interment of Metropolitan Anthony. MAY HIS MEMORY BE ETERNAL.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRIEST

My beloved brothers and sisters,

“Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back.” (Luke 6:37-38- NRSV). It is again time for us to prepare ourselves to observe Great Lent. This is a spiritual journey that we

must take in order to bring meaning into our own lives of that unique and unrepeatable event of the glorious Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

One of the steps that we should take during this Lenten period is to practice the spirit of forgiveness. This concept is so important that each true Christian and follower of Christ must make it a way of life.

If we read Matthew 18:21-35, we will not find room for uncertainty about Jesus' meaning regarding forgiveness. When He says "forgive seven times seven," He means forgive without limit, forgive always. Therefore the Christian ideal is to make forgiveness a way of life.

We should also read Matthew 6:14-21, the reading from the Holy Gospel on Cheesefare Sunday. Even in this text it is very clear that "if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses neither will your father forgive your trespasses."

Despite these teachings, we know how difficult it is to practice this high standard in our daily lives. By forgiving others, we risk exposing ourselves, over and over, to the cruelty and unfaithfulness of uncaring offenders.

In our daily lives, however, to accept and practice forgiveness as a way of life is to share God's spirit. He stands ready to forgive. The ability to forgive others their offenses comes to us only from God and He will empower us to practice forgiveness, if we ask for it. His own words tell us, "Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back." (Luke 6:37-38).

The inability to forgive leads one toward decay, hate, fear, and ultimately, spiritual death. "To forgive, (always, not only before and during Great Lent), is to invent in the creation of a more human and loving society. Yes, it does sometimes lead to suffering and pain and disappointment, but forgiveness is powerful formative agent. The presence of confirmed forgiveness makes a difference in any context."

The power that we need to make forgiveness an integral part of our Christian lives is found in the shadow of the Cross is God's clearest call to a forgiving life style. May we follow Christ's example during this upcoming Lenten period and always. Amen.
