And hopefully we are all praying daily at home with our families. All is well.

It is during times like these, when we are actively growing and living in Christ, that we must be ever vigilant. Our patron Saint Anthony has warned us to be vigilant of

the snares of the Evil One. Why? Because it is in these good times, when the Holy Spirit is actively working through the children of God, when the Evil One comes after us. Why is that? Because the Devil seeks, chases, harasses, pursues "the good ones," especially when they are growing closer to God. Think about it. He already possesses "the bad ones." He does not have to devote any time and energy on what and who he already controls. But on us, the children of God, he dedicates much effort.

In the Gospel of Matthew, when Peter unknowingly spoke words from the Devil, Jesus rebuked him and said to the Devil tempting Peter in that moment, "*Get be*hind Me, Satan! You are an offense to Me, for you are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of *Men.*" (Matt 16-23). The Devil, the deceiver, comes after us when and in ways we least expect and are least able to immediately perceive.

In light of this reality, we must be aware of the existence of the Evil One in the world, how he works in the spiritual realm, and how we can fight against him. This is where the idea for the Spiritual Retreat at the end of October was conceived. The Weekend Retreat is called, "You've Got To Be Here - Saint Anthony's Something for Everyone Weekend." The title is a plea to all parishioners to come to Church that weekend to learn and understand how the devil works against each one of us (young and old); how to fight back against him; and the importance of fighting back against him.

This past month we hosted the most successful GreekFest in our recent history. (See page 6 & 7 for photos) Many people commentated that it was the best Festival they have ever attended. I would like to thank all of our volunteers and do-

nors who gave their hard work and generosity that made Pasadena GreekFest such a success! There are many, many people who gave their tireless efforts, but at this time I wanted to specifically acknowledge my co-chairs Charlie Christos and Jimmy Christos who put in extensive hours and dealt with extensive logistical challenges posed by us returning to Santa Anita.

Despite the many challenges with the new site, the GreekFest team executed and produced a tremendous event. The gross receipts and attendance were the highest ever on our former location "back at the track" at Santa Anita Park. Andi it is not too early to be thinking of next year. We have a tremendous opportunity as a community given the enhanced popularity of Pasadena GreekFest (arguably the best Greek Festival in California) and the anticipated increased attendance next year. We could really put on a very special event on an even larger scale. The only think holding us back is the amount of volunteers. This year, with a few exceptions, we had the same number of leaders and booth captains involved in the Festival. Next year, we will have to have much more involvement by the entire community in order to reach our full potential. With all the talent, capability, and dedication in our parish, there is no reason why we cannot all contribute and answer the call next September.

In other news, as everyone knows, the old hall is no longer there. We are well underway with the building of your new Parish Center to provide all the programs to fulfill the spiritual needs of the St. Anthony community. The project is no longer in the planning stage but is now a reality. The new Parish Center is scheduled to open in September 2011 if all goes well with the construction. It will be a state of the art facility that will house our various programs and community events for many decades and will greatly strengthen St. Anthony in many ways. The Parish Center will serve as the center of our Parish life when church is not in session and will truly be a home away from home for us.

For that reason, we need everyone's commitment to "our new home." While we have accomplished a lot in our fundraising, we have yet to reach our goals. If we do not reach our fundraising goals, we will need to obtain a loan to complete the project and will also scale back some of the design and functionality of the facility. As we approach the end of 2010, I would like to personally ask each of you who have not yet pledged to the building project to reflect on what St. Anthony means to you and your family. We need your help and support.

Finally, Congratulations to John Tarazi and Kathy Lucas for being selected to receive the Spirit of Stewardship Award by the Metropolis! They were honored at a regional Metropolis banquet on October 2nd, hosted by Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church in Northridge. The Spirit of Stewardship Awards program for the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of San Francisco is an opportunity to honor the many dedicated individuals who give unselfishly of their time, talents, and resources to support the ministries of their local parishes and Metropolis. John and Kathy have been true stewards of our Saint Anthony parish, faithfully and humbly serving for several decades. They are truly deserving of this award.

### "I will sing to the Lord as long as I live" (psalm 104:33)

It is Sunday morning. You decide to give in to the alarm clock after hitting the snooze button several times and you slowly get ready to go to Church. When you arrive and open the doors to Saint Anthony, you hear the uplifting voices of the choir and begin to feel more calm knowing you are in God's house. You see the familiar faces in the Narthex and you can smell the aromatic incense and beeswax as you light a candle and venerate the icons. As you open the glass doors and walk into the nave of the church, the choir's collective voices sound clearer and louder as you are welcomed by the beautiful colors and familiar faces on the walls. You take a seat and you take part in the Divine Liturgy.

The question is *How* do you take part in the Divine Liturgy?

The word Liturgy ( $\Lambda \epsilon_{ITOUPYia}$ ) comes from the Greek Word  $\lambda a \delta c$  (laos- the people) and  $\epsilon p \gamma o$  (ergo- work), so in other words, the Liturgy is the Work of the People and it is Divine because of our Lord Jesus Christ. So when you take your seat in the pews, grab the Liturgy book and the hymn sheet from the bulletin, follow along and try to sing with the choir. We take part in the Liturgy when we are involved by praying, and singing/ chanting from our heart, with one *collective* voice and one mind. When the Priest or the Deacon exclaims "For heavenly peace and for the salvation of our souls, let us pray to the Lord" everyone responds "Lord Have Mercy!"

After seeing the new show "Glee," I noticed how the high school Students in the Glee Club, sing together with all that they have. In other words, they sing with all of their being, expressing themselves through this art. The art of music is man's expression of their inner-self, and we use music to glorify God. In the Old Testament, King David wrote and sung many psalms to God, showing praise and thanks while playing the harp. The Ancient Greeks chanted solemn hymns in their temples, and in the Early Church, the Christians sang hymns on the way to entering the Church together, as the Bishop led them with the Gospel (this is why we have the small entrance). We express the words and doctrine of our faith together through the art of music. So come to church ready to sing and glorify God with all of our heart, mind, soul and strength!

### The Gurus, the Young Man, and Elder Paisios

### by: Dionysios Farasiotis

This powerful memoir tells the story of a Greek youth who, out of a desire to know the truth empirically, began to experiment in yoga, hypnotism, and various occult techniques. Eventually drawn back to the Faith of his forefathers—Orthodox Christianity—he visited

the ancient monastic republic of Mount Athos in his native Greece, where he was brought to a knowledge of the Truth of Jesus Christ by the saintly Elder Paisios (1924-1994). Nevertheless, believing he had only found "part of the truth" on the Holy Mountain, he chose to give the "same opportunity" to Hindu yogis that he had given to Elder Paisios and other Orthodox monks. Thus, at the age of twenty-five, he embarked on a trip to India, where he undertook his search in the ashrams of three famous gurus, one of whom was worshipped as a god. His experiences in India, along with his subsequent encounters with Elder Paisios on Mount Athos, are recounted in the present book in vivid detail.Popular in Greece since its first publication there in 2001, The Gurus, the Young Man, and Elder Paisios is a page-turning narrative of both outward adventures and inward struggles. What stands out most in this book, however, is the radiant image of Elder



Paisios, possessed of divine gifts, laboring in prayer for his fellow man, and overflowing with unconditional love. Through this, one sees the uncreated Source of the elder's love and of the author's spiritual transformation: the true God-man Jesus Christ, Who honors man's personal freedom while drawing him, through love, into everlasting union with Himself.
