

St. Anthony's Greek Language School 2019-2020

Starting Dates: Friday September 13th, 2019 – Monday September 16th, 2019

End of school year Date: Friday May 29th, 2020

Preschool: ages 3 ½ – 5 ½

When: Monday 4-6 p.m.

Teach the students basic vocabulary (greetings, names for everyday objects, and simple phrases) through games, conversation, songs, poems, short stories, drawing and other activities. No homework assignments are included in the curriculum.

Kindergarten: ages 5 1/2 – 7

When: Monday 4-6 p.m.

Emphasis is placed on listening, repeating and memorizing. Workbook is used for reading and writing. Homework assignments are given.

Beginners I-II-III: ages 7 and older

When: Monday 4-6 p.m.

Basic grammar rules and syntax are introduced. Short stories are part of the curriculum, along with spelling words. Homework, lesson and unit tests are given.

Beginners I-II-III: ages 7 and older

When: Friday 4-7 p.m.

Basic grammar rules and syntax are introduced. Short stories are part of the curriculum, along with spelling words. Homework, lesson and unit tests are given.

Intermediate I-II-III

When: Friday 4-7 p.m.

Basic grammar rules and syntax are emphasized. Spelling and dictation words are given every week. History and culture are part of the curriculum. Students are expected to write composition every two weeks. Homework, lesson and unit tests are given.

Advanced I-II-III

When: Friday 4-7 p.m.

Skimming, careful reading and intensive reading are introduced. Concentration is placed on writing skills, grammar and syntax. A variety of books will be used. Longer stories and poems are part of the curriculum, as well as history and culture. Students are expected to write a composition every two weeks. Homework, lesson and unit tests are given.

Certificate of Attainment in Greek (levels A1-C2)

Preparatory courses to obtain the Certificates of Attainment in Greek (Hellenic Ministry of National Education). Certificates offer foreign language credits in the U.S.A., academic credits and employment advantages in Greece and the European Union (levels C1-C2).

Adult Classes

Modern Greek Adult I-II-III

Focus is placed on reading, writing and talking ordinary daily dialogues. Basic grammar rules, speech, syntax, translation and vocabulary are emphasized. Reading and listening comprehension are part of the class. Homework is given every week.
