Unassailed by Hades, You divested it of spoils. Then You met the Virgin. You granted life. O Lord, risen from the dead, glory to You!

Upon the mountain were You transfigured, and Your disciples beheld Your glory as far as they were able, O Christ our God; so that when they would see You crucified they might understand that Your Passion was deliberate, and declare to the world that in truth You are the Father's radiance.

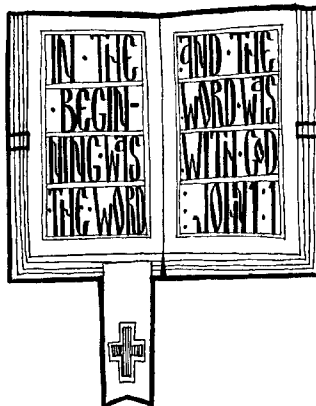


GOSPEL READING

The Gospel According to Matthew 9:27-35

But they went away and spread his fame through all that district. As they were going away, behold, a dumb demoniac was brought to him. 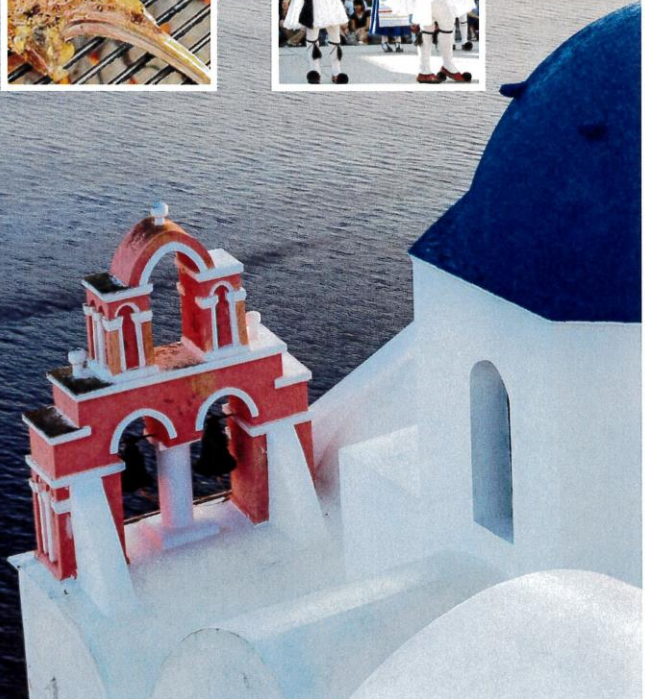
